“Sir, give me this water...”

John 4:15



Jesus' encounter with the woman at the well in John 4 has long been a pivotal scripture for Cornerstone Among Women, as she is a model of so many of the women we see in our center. She represents those who have sought love in all the wrong places, who are often filled with the shame of their lifestyles, and who feel very much alone, even among their peers. The woman had gone out of her way to be at the well when no one else would be there.

Jesus had gone out of His way too, for the normal route back to Galilee was not through Samaria. Jesus breached rigid social customs in asking a woman, let alone a Samaritan woman, for water; and He, a Rabbi, exhibited a marked departure from what was acceptable in conversing with a woman of ill repute.

Her need for water brought her to the well at that precise moment. He who was Living Water (Jeremiah 2:13) supplied her need in a way she never anticipated.

Cornerstone Among Women is going to "Samaria" in 2011. We are taking our new western Cuyahoga County "Center on Wheels" (a mobile medical van), to the clients where we will offer free pregnancy testing, limited ultrasound, referrals for services and support...and the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Just as the woman at the well's need for water opened the way for Christ, so too will our future clients' need for intervention and support open the way for LIFE.

"If anyone is thirsty, let him come to Me and drink. He who believes in Me, as the scripture said, 'From his innermost being will flow rivers of living water.'" John 7:37-38

She came up to me in church to share her story. Twenty-five years ago she was pregnant, single and being pressured to abort. Our prolife ministry was fledgling at the time, but the advocate who was there for her was confident. She made her "feel good about herself" and she encouraged her to "choose life," which she ultimately did. An adoption agency helped with the placement of the infant boy in a loving home, and with the Lord's help, her grief was minimal. Several years later a double portion was granted to fill her heart and her home. She and her husband welcomed into this world, twins.

VOLUNTEER IMPACT

This ministry could not operate with staff members alone. Numerous volunteers sacrificially give of themselves in all aspects of the ministry to save lives. Last year approximately 2,000 Client Services volunteer hours and 499 professional hours were recorded. In addition, through the benevolence of the church and community, 711 Baby Bucks were redeemed for diapers, formula, wipes and baby clothing and furnishings.

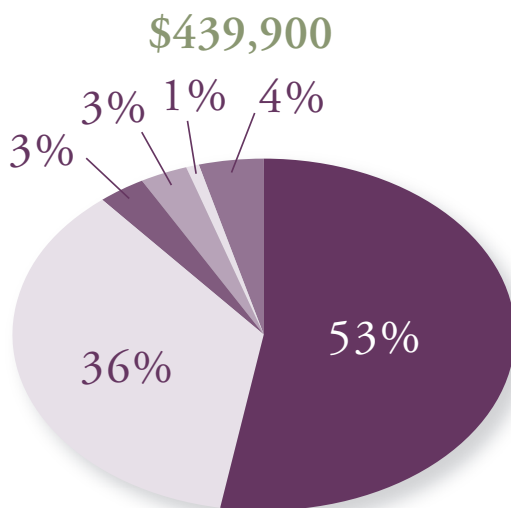

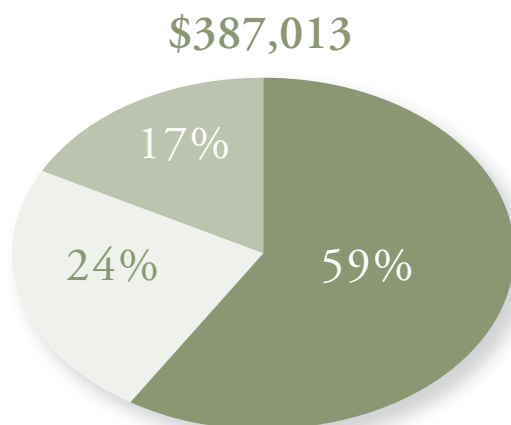
TOTAL INCOME FOR 2010
